National Donate Life Month, initiated by Donate Life America, highlights the invaluable role of Department of Motor Vehicles and Driver License Partners in advancing the mission of organ donation. This month serves as a token of appreciation for their unwavering dedication to the cause of saving lives.

"I know personally that a donation of life does not come close to easing the pain of the loss of a loved one," said Supervisor Wagner. "But it does leave one lasting and enduring memory: that of helping other human beings. And that is priceless – like the gift of life."

DMV staff across the country play a pivotal role by asking donor registration question to customers daily, thus providing individuals with the opportunity to express their willingness to be organ donors upon their passing. Through these interactions, partnerships with DMVs have become the cornerstone of state donor registration efforts, resulting in over 170 million donor registrations in the United States.

OCTA Seeks Applicants for Taxpayer Oversight Committee

Members of Taxpayer Oversight Committee ensure Measure M tax dollars are allocated as intended

ORANGE – The Orange County Transportation Authority is seeking qualified volunteers to serve on the Taxpayer Oversight Committee, the committee that ensures transportation funds are being spent as intended.

The Taxpayer Oversight Committee (TOC) is an 11-member committee that monitors OCTA's use of Measure M funds. The half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements was overwhelmingly renewed in 2006 after first being approved by voters in 1990.

Recruitment to the TOC is currently taking place through May 4, 2025, for openings in the First, Third, Fourth and Fifth Supervisorial Districts of Orange County. Interviews of interested and qualified candidates will be held May 12 – 16.

The committee reviews the use of the local sales tax funds, ensuring that all revenue collected are spent on voter-approved transportation projects. The Measure M plan improves and preserves Orange County's quality of life, keeping people moving while minimizing impacts to the environment.

Measure M is a balanced plan, expected to generate approximately \$14 billion through 2041, with 43% of the net funding dedicated to freeway improvements, 32% to local street projects and 25% to transit.

Applications for a three-year committee term, which runs from July 2025 to June 2028, will be accepted through May 4. Applicants must be Orange County residents, at least 18 years old and live in the Supervisorial District that they will represent.

The **Third District** consists of the cities of Lake Forest, Mission Viejo, Rancho Santa Margarita, Villa Park, Yorba Linda, portions of Anaheim, Irvine, Orange, Tustin, the unincorporated communities of Modjeska, Silverado, Trabuco Canyon, Williams Canyon, and a portion of the unincorporated community of North Tustin.

Capistrano, portions of Irvine and the unincorporated communities of Coto de Caza, Ladera Ranch, Las Flores and Rancho Mission Viejo.

PORTABLE BACKUP BATTERY AND SOLAR PANEL FOR CRITICAL CARE CUSTOMERS IN HIGH FIRE RISK AREAS

The Critical Care Backup Battery Program provides a free portable backup battery to power medical equipment during emergencies. Eligible customers must be enrolled in SCE's Medical Baseline Allowance program and live in a Tier 2 or 3 high fire risk area.

This program provides customers with rebates to help buy down the cost of a portable backup battery or portable generator. Customers who live in a Tier 2 or 3 high fire risk area can receive a \$150 rebate on qualifying portable power stations or a \$200 rebate on qualifying portable generators. Customers enrolled in CARE, FERA or the Medical Baseline Allowance program may receive a \$600 rebate on qualifying portable generators.


